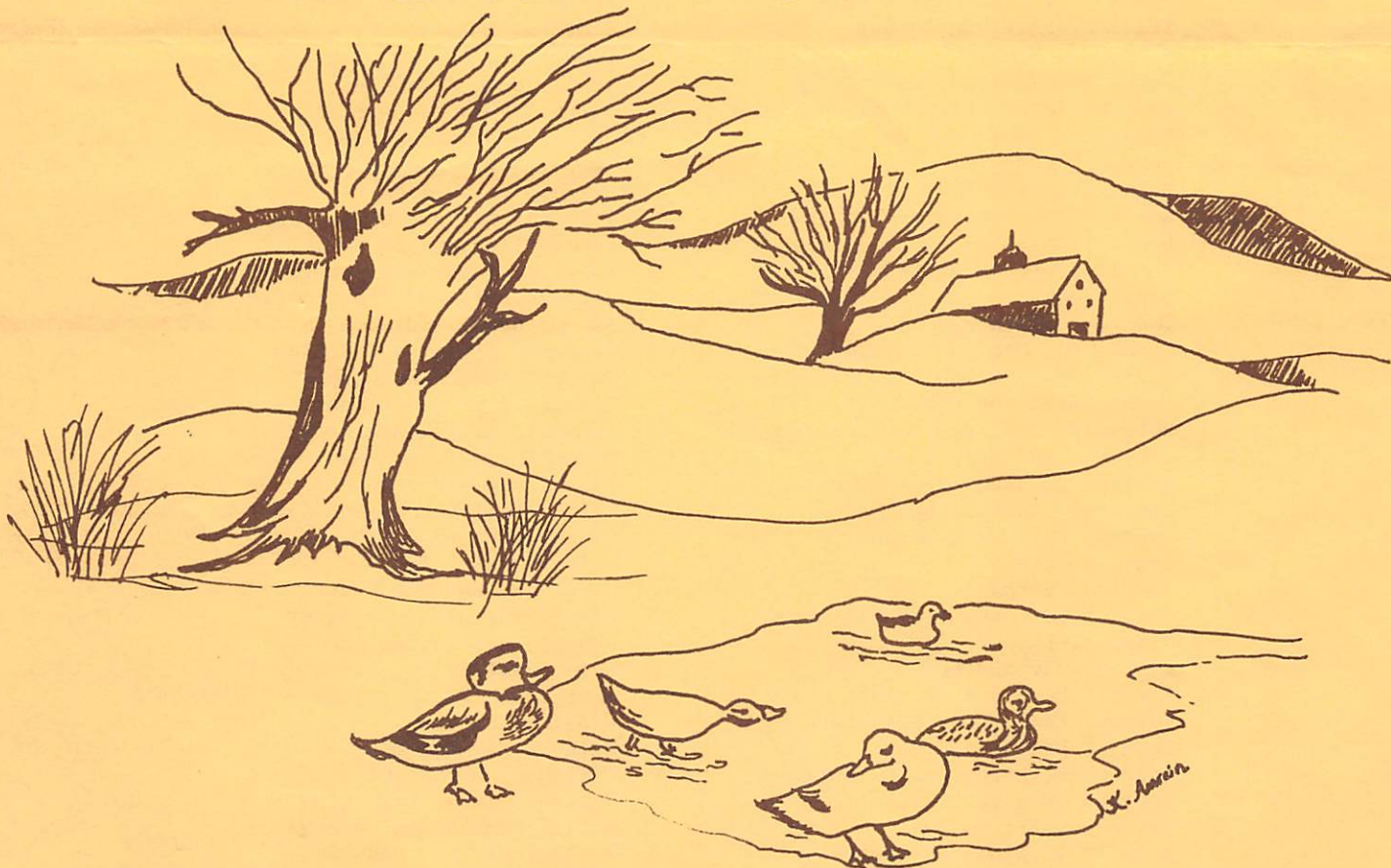

Both of our new acquisitions border the Smith property in the northwest corner of the Town of Canton.

CHRISTMAS TREE FARM - In 1980, the Canton Land Conservation Trust assumed the stewardship of the Christmas Tree Farm at the Smith property on Doyle Road. Many hours of work are required for the planting and grooming of the trees. Members and friends are encouraged to participate in this process.
