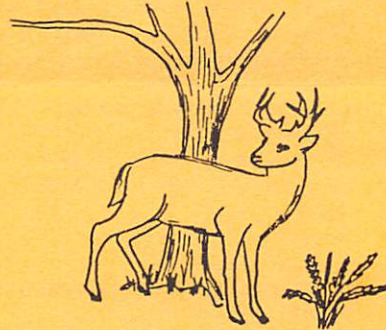

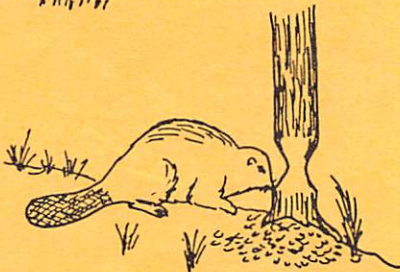
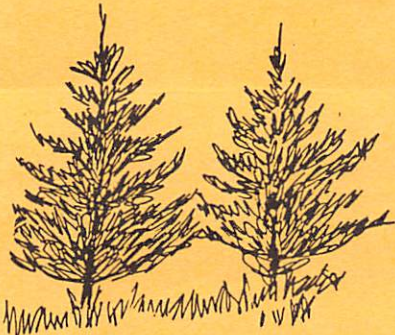

LAND TRUST NEWS

PICNIC, HIKES SCHEDULED FOR JUNE 7th - The Canton Land Conservation Trust's annual meeting will be held on Sunday afternoon, June 7th at the Smith property on Doyle Road. A picnic supper at 5:00 PM will precede a short business meeting. Hamburgers, hot dogs and buns and cold drinks will be supplied by the Board of Directors. Please RSVP before June 1st by calling Jay Kaplan 693-0263 (days) or Alan Duncan 693-6859 (evenings). Town residents and members who wish to learn more about their Land Trust properties are encouraged to join in on one of two hikes scheduled for that afternoon preceding the picnic. At 4 PM, there will be a one-hour tour of the 77 acre Smith property. Those with a more adventuresome spirit may meet in the Cherry Brook School parking lot at 2 PM for a moderate 2 1/2 hour hike through some of our most scenic properties; beginning at the Capen property off Breezy Hill Road and ending up at the Smith property in time for dinner at 5 PM. Each walk will be led by members of the Board of Directors.

CHRISTMAS TREE FARM - In 1980, the Canton Land Conservation Trust assumed the stewardship of the Christmas Tree Farm at the Wilson F. Smith property on Doyle Road. The Smith Farm is a 77 acre parcel covering both sides of Doyle Road and extending from North Canton into Barkhamsted. Approximately five acres are under cultivation as a Christmas tree plantation. A tree sale is held each year, usually two weekends prior to Christmas. Replanting takes place in the spring - this year on Saturday, May 9th (raindate May 16th). The annual meeting of the Members of the Canton Land Conservation Trust, Inc. will be held on Sunday, June 7, 1987, at 5:00 PM at the Smith property on Doyle Road, Canton, Connecticut. At the meeting, the Board of Directors will propose for adoption by the Members a revised set of By-Laws. The proposed By-Laws include the following changes: increasing the maximum number of Directors from 15 to 24; changing the quorum requirement; changing the fiscal year; establishing a nominating committee for officer and Director positions; providing for removal of Directors and officers; increasing the terms of officers to two years; and changing membership categories.

From the turnpike: New England woods

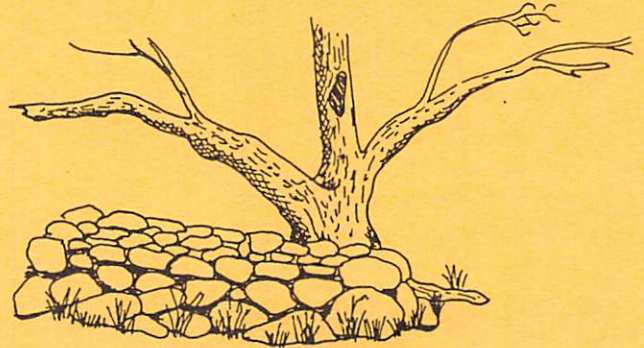
From highways engineered across the hills, woodland conceals
