

# Canton Land Conservation Trust, Inc.

Fall 2003 Newsletter

The Land Trust seeks to promote the preservation of open space in Canton. Occasionally, however, a piece of land is offered to the Land Trust and not accepted. Why is that? The Land Trust seeks to own properties that have significant recreational, habitat and open space value. The Land Trust has limited resources for land management, and wants to spend its stewardship activities on the parcels that have the most open space value for Canton. Our acquisition committee has developed selection criteria against which all potential acquisitions are measured.

Some of the more important criteria are significance, contiguity to other open space, and size. The significance of a particular parcel of open space depends on many things, including its location, quality, natural resources, and visual appeal. Properties with unusual flora or fauna, views, or unique character are most desirable. Property such as detention ponds, swales, or with potential maintenance issues are generally not desirable.

The proximity of a particular piece of land to existing or potential future open space tracts is also an important consideration. The Land Trust has been able to assemble contiguous parcels upon which we have built and maintained trails enjoyed by the public. Contiguity is also a major factor in creating and maintaining wildlife habitats and corridors, which become increasingly crucial as more of Canton's land is developed for residential subdivisions.

Size matters. Bigger blocks of open space create more opportunities to preserve views and habitat, and to promote passive recreation. Larger pieces also create better opportunities for the Land Trust's stewardship program. Larger, contiguous tracts are easier to manage and maintain than smaller, scattered and fragmented parcels.

Many parcels come to our attention because of Canton subdivision regulations, which require that applicants seeking to subdivide 10 or more acres reserve up to 15% of the subject land (or up to 30% of the land in the case of an open space subdivision) as dedicated open space. The Land Trust works closely with the Canton Conservation Commission to determine whether proposed open space should be preserved by means of a transfer to the Land Trust (or to another third party such as the Town), or by a permanent conservation easement placed on the property.

Charlotte Goodwin Craig, a longtime benefactor of the Canton Land Trust, died August 24th. donated the first parcel of land to the Trust in 1973. She served on the board for a number of years. Charlotte was not only interested in the preservation of Canton's open spaces, but was also keenly interested in preserving the architecture in her community: she sat on the committee that founded the Canton Center Historic District. Charlotte was also deeply concerned about the welfare of others, and where she saw a need, she acted. She cofounded the Canton Food Bank in the early 80s and continued to coordinate its activities until 2000. Charlotte loved the outdoors and was an avid hiker, becoming a member of the prestigious Adirondack 46ers at a relatively young age. The Land Trust's first blazed trail was named in her honor and is located on the Wilson Smith Preserve. Charlotte will be remembered for her generous spirit and modest demeanor. She will be missed by all who knew her and whose lives she touched.

# **Swan Preserve Trail**

The Swan Preserve has a wonderful new trail, and is in the process of getting new and more convenient parking. This is our first parking lot, and will enable people to hike at this popular spot without having to park along Case Street.



# Access to Cherry Brook

Fred and Harold Humphrey and their sister Lucy Wong have given the Land Trust an easement along approximately 1500 feet of the east side of Cherry Brook in the back of their woodlot off West Road, with the intent for us to build a trail for public access. This section of Cherry Brook is particularly beautiful and contains a large swimming hole. We are most excited and appreciative about this gift. We are looking forward to creating the trail, and to taking a dip on a hot summer day next year.

# An Open Letter to our Members and Friends

A legacy is something inherited or passed down from one person to another. Canton is our legacy, which we have inherited or come to own in one way or another to do with as we wish. Now we have a choice. We can sit back while others use the land for private gain or we can help to preserve some of Canton's beauty and even work to enhance that beauty. How often have we heard someone say, "I can remember when there were no buildings in that area, only fields and woods?"

The paragraph above appeared in the Canton Land Conservation Trust newsletter almost thirty years ago. Your Land Trust has been very successful over the past thirty years acquiring, protecting and maintaining some of the most beautiful properties and important habitats in Canton. Most of this has come as the result of the amazing generosity and foresight of Canton residents and lovers of the land. The Land Trust had not purchased a property from its owner until 2000. All the property acquired prior to that was donated, except for one preserve purchased for back taxes.

While it may seem that we have protected a great amount of open space, there are still important areas in town that are vulnerable to loss. Everybody in town knows that the golf course has given way to development. Everybody in town also knows that Sweetheart Mountain hangs in the balance. There are a number of other properties now or soon to be available, including farms, ridge tops and forests. Right now, your Land Trust is in negotiation for several properties. To purchase just those properties in current negotiation will cost some \$150,000 more than the entire noncommitted assets of the Land Trust, necessitating some serious fund-raising. In addition, there are other important properties that need to be acted on quickly, or be lost forever.

We can certainly prioritize, and protect those that give us the biggest bang for our buck. Unfortunately, we seem to be right now at a crossroads, where the pressure for change is great, and we need to act now or lose the signature properties we identify with Canton.

It is of the highest importance for you, the people of Canton, to support the acquisition and preservation of as many of these properties as we can possibly afford, at a time when they are in danger of being gone forever. Please be as generous as you can, and make a contribution this season to the Land Trust's acquisition fund. The need is great, and the opportunity at this very moment is with us. The window may close.

# New Trail at SWW

As an Eagle Scout project, Robert Maglietti devoted a great deal of time and effort this past spring and summer to completing a new trail at our Sun, Wind & Woodland Preserve on Breezy Hill Road. The trail will be named in honor of Tom Perry, whose foresight and generosity provided the Land Trust with many gifts of land and who was also instrumental in the protection of Sun, Wind & Woodland before the Land Trust acquired it.

Robert is a tenth grader at Canton High and a member of Avon Scout Troop 274. Robert did a lot of the physical work, and he organized and supervised work parties that included fellow scouts and adults and constructed a sign complete with trail map and space for additional information at the trail head. A total of 174 volunteer person-hours were given by Robert and his workers. It is a job well done and well worthy of the Eagle Scout badge. The new trail is 1.5 miles long, and goes through historical farm terrain and a good variety of flora and fauna.

Hey kids, do you like to go hiking but you're not sure where the Canton Land Trust trails are? Why not become a Trailblazer and we will help you find out! The CLT Trailblazers is a kid friendly adventure club for kids ages 5-13. We meet once a month from October- April. The yearly \$5 membership includes a Trailblazer Activity Book with directions and information to all the hiking trails maintained by the Canton Land Trust. The hikes are Family hikes. This past year was our first year and we enjoyed some fun hikes including a scavenger hunt hike, night hike, animal tracking hike, vernal pool exploration and orienteering.
